The grant will help further Frontier's efforts in manufactured housing by:

- Fostering innovative, replicable products and approaches that illustrate the use of manufactured housing as an affordable housing and asset building strategy.
- Building a field of practitioners knowledgeable about this field and how it impacts low-income families and communities.
- Laying the groundwork for a national policy discourse that takes into account the true costs and opportunities of manufactured housing.

Frontier recently launched its newest product; an energy-efficient, single-section manufactured housing unit with quality upgrades such as improved insulation levels and windows, vinyl siding, shutters, and shingled roofs. These upgrades will help to ensure a longer life span of the unit and increased energy efficiency for low-income homebuyers. These units will guarantee that very low-income homebuyers do not sacrifice quality for affordability.

### ***About CFED and I'm HOME***

CFED, a national not-for-profit organization, is unlocking the manufactured housing potential through an initiative called I'M HOME, or Innovations in Manufactured Homes. I'M HOME supports programs across the country that are helping families who choose manufactured homes. To be good investments for these families, manufactured homes must be well-built and installed on a proper foundation once they reach their destination. Their financing must be fair and affordable. Homeowners should own, or have long-term control over, the land underneath the homes. And, finally, when it's time to move, the homeowners must be able to sell the homes at a fair value.
